The President

multifaceted organization as demanding as Belhaven University requires a team of specialized leaders who can get the most from our enormous mission and finite resources. I am deeply grateful for the experience, wisdom, professionalism, work ethic, and ingenuity of the six Vice Presidents who comprise my "Administrative Team." Collectively, we have 111 years of service to Belhaven University and 169 years of higher education experience.

Operating Belhaven University is complex.

- This fall our enrollment is 4,100 students, with just under 1,000 students enrolled in undergraduate programs on campus, along with another 600 students completing their baccalaureate degree online, nearly 1,800 students earning a master's or doctoral degree, 600 international students studying at the graduate level in the US, and 100 doctoral students in China.
- Belhaven's operating budget totals \$1 million each week
 52 weeks of the year with compensation accounting for 56% of the budget. We employ 777 full and part-time faculty and staff. We must meet every federal regulation in handling the over
 \$70 million in government aid to our students.
- We offer 70 fields of academic study to our campus students. Through sophisticated online delivery systems, we offer 10 undergraduate, 16 master, and 2 doctoral degree programs – business and education.
- Belhaven fields seventeen NCAA Division III athletic teams, employs over 50 coaches and graduate assistants, and operates a variety of athletic venues. We host game-day for more than 100 home games/meets/matches each year.
- We run a 60-acre campus that is a small town itself, our facilities ranging from a brand-new parking garage to our 113-year-old historic halls. We operate science laboratories, arts studios, performance venues, gathering places, convention spaces, classrooms of all shapes and sizes, and an array of administrative offices. Our utility bills are over \$2 million a year.



- The University must meet the demands of the institutional accreditor along with individual program accreditors' requirements. We must adhere precisely to state and federal government regulators, and international higher education laws. We must meet the reporting demands of financial auditors, insurers, and bankers. We must operate within the boundaries of the NCAA, Title IX, and Title IV. We must provide cyber defense for tens of thousands of computer attacks directed at us and other American universities.
- Our standard is Christ, and our highest priority is to build a Christian worldview into every educational, residential, athletic, and extracurricular activity. We hold required weekly chapel services, support a

multitude of campus bible study groups, welcome RUF and Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and provide financial assistance for our students participating in shortterm mission trips.

In managing the complexity of the University, I rely on the gifts of our six Vice Presidents to provide leadership in their areas of responsibility (see page 27) and to work collaboratively

and creatively to solve the challenges facing Christian higher education today.

The LORD has blessed Belhaven with leaders who are toplevel professionals and, most importantly, are driven by our mission to honor Christ in all we do.

Belhaven University's Dance Department is celebrating a significant milestone—30 years of shaping and inspiring the art of dance.



he story of Belhaven University's Dance Department began in 1994, when the University introduced a dance minor in collaboration with Ballet Magnificat!, a professional Christian ballet company based in Jackson, Mississippi. Belhaven and Ballet Magnificat! shared facilities and faculty for several years. Keith and Kathy Thibodeaux, founders of Ballet Magnificat!, provided encouragement and counsel as Belhaven University developed a premier Christ-centered collegiate dance program. This partnership laid the foundation for what would become a thriving dance major by 1997, supported by the construction of two new dance studios in 2000.

In 2005, Belhaven achieved a prestigious milestone: accreditation from the National Association of Schools for Dance, making it one of only 39 institutions nationwide to hold national accreditation in all four fine arts programs - dance, theatre, music, and visual arts.

The following year saw the opening of the Bitsy Irby Visual Arts and Dance Center, a modern facility that has become a cornerstone of the department's success. The program began with one small dance studio on campus, and students and faculty now enjoy five state-of-the-art studios in the Bitsy Irby Visual Arts and Dance Center.

What started with only a dance minor in 1994 has blossomed into several high-quality degrees that include a Bachelor of Arts in Dance. Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance, and a Master of Fine Arts in dance, as well as a Pilates Instructor Certification. The introduction of an M.F.A. program in 2013 positioned Belhaven as the only evangelical Christian university in the U.S. to offer this advanced degree.

Top-notch dance instructors from around the country took notice of what Belhaven was doing and wanted to join the burgeoning team.

"Seeing the growth of the faculty and staff who serve and support the Belhaven University Dance

Department has been a joy," said Krista Bower, Chair and Professor of Dance and Dean of the School of Fine Arts. "While the department launched with a small staff, we are now blessed to have six fulltime dance faculty, two specialty instructors, several adjunct instructors, a full-time dance athletic trainer, a director of dance production, a director of dance costuming, an administrative assistant, and a director of music for dance. Almost every dance technique class has live accompaniment by professional

continue to advance and are utilized globally, the arts are increasingly becoming part of this development," observed Newland.

The Belhaven Dance Department has evolved with the hiring of faculty specializing in areas such as dance technology and hip-hop. Implementing courses like Dance and Technology and Choreography with the Camera provide the opportunity for dance to be experienced beyond the stage in live settings. Newland adds, "These technologies expand the

dance-making and crafting process and enhance the viewer's ability to experience dance on demand." Today, the department continues its tradition of strong training in ballet and modern dance technique and has also expanded offerings to include courses in jazz, tap, hip-hop, and aerial dance. Additionally, various dance styles continue to evolve around the world, and Belhaven provides students the opportunity to train in multiple dance forms and genres, aiming to prepare them to enter the marketplace, ministry, or workforce.

Over the years, Newland has seen many changes but has noticed one aspect that has not changed. "The University's mission to prepare students academically and spiritually to serve Christ Jesus in their careers, in human relationships, and in the world of ideas has remained constant. By fostering a supportive environment where academic rigor meets spiritual growth, Belhaven encourages students to engage with diverse perspectives, collaborate across disciplines, and develop a holistic understanding of their

The NEW FACE of BELHAVEN FOOTBALL: COACH CJ NIGHTINGALE

elhaven Athletics is excited to welcome CJ Nightingale as the eighth Head Football Coach in Blazers' history.

"We are thankful to have CJ, Shanel, and their family join us as CJ leads our football program," said Vice President of Athletics Scott Little. "His love for Christ, commitment to young men's growth, and competitive success align perfectly with our mission."

"CJ is ideally equipped to be an outstanding head coach," added Belhaven President Dr. Roger Parrott. "He has a track record of demonstrating love for his players and preparing young men for life beyond football."

Nightingale has extensive experience at the NCAA Division III level, having played for Wheaton College and coaching at both NCAA Division III and NAIA levels.

"Shanel and I, along with our family, are excited to join the Belhaven community," said Nightingale. "It's rare in college football to combine loving Jesus with championship football, and we get to do that with Blazers Football."

Nightingale arrives after four seasons as Defensive Coordinator at Wheaton College, where the Thunder reached the NCAA Division III playoffs each year and won the CCIW in 2019. In 2022, Nightingale participated in the AFCA 35 Under 35 Leadership Institute, aimed at developing young coaches. He has also spoken at AFCA and Glazier Coaching Clinics.

This past season, his defense finished as the #2 defense in points and yards allowed in the CCIW. Nightingale's 2021 defense led the nation in Total Sacks and was ranked second in Rushing Yards Allowed.

In 2019, his unit was the top scoring defense in the country, earning him a finalist spot for FootballScoop.com's NCAA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year Award.

During his tenure at Wheaton, Nightingale coached 24 All-Conference players and seven All-Americans. He also coached CCIW and National Defensive Player of the Year, Dallas McRae.

Prior to Wheaton, Nightingale served as Special Teams
Coordinator and Linebackers
Coach at Indiana Wesleyan
University from 2017-2019. He started his coaching career at
Greenville University as Defensive
Backs Coach in 2016.

Nightingale was a four-year letter-winner at Wheaton as a defensive back and return



specialist, contributing to a CCIW Championship team in 2012.

With a strong background as both a player and coach, Nightingale is highly regarded by those who have worked with him.

"I had the privilege of coaching CJ at Wheaton," said Mike Swider, former Head Coach. "He is a football guy with an exceptional grasp of the game and a desire to inspire young men."

"CJ Nightingale is a winner," added Ron Sanberg, former Wheaton Defensive Coordinator. "He has a great football mind and deeply cares about his players."

Nightingale takes over a Belhaven program coming off its most successful season, finishing 9-1 and winning the first outright conference championship, along with its first NCAA playoff appearance.

Belhaven's Fashion Merchandising Students Explore NYC's Fashion Industry

elhaven University's Fashion Merchandising students had an exciting opportunity this past spring, as they ventured to New York City to study the intersection of fashion, art, and business. From April 29 to May 4, eight students,

> accompanied by faculty members, immersed themselves in the fast-paced world of fashion during the program's inaugural study tour.

The trip developed by Emily Blalock, Associate Professor in the

School of Business, and Nate Theisen, Co-Chair of the Art and Design Department, was designed to give students firsthand experience of the interdisciplinary nature of fashion and business in one of the world's largest fashion hubs—New York City's Garment District.

"Our goal was to blend fashion and business in a way that's relevant and real," said Blalock. "We wanted to offer students the chance to experience every angle of the fashion industry—from concept to consumer."

The students' itinerary was packed with meetings from some of the most influential fashion brands and industry executives. Over the course of the trip, the group engaged with 12 industry leaders, including top executives from renowned companies such as CHANEL, American Eagle Outfitters, FULLBEAUTY Brands, Caleres, Shoshanna, and Nordstrom.

"These executives didn't just offer insights-they opened doors," said Blalock. "Many offered internship programs to our students, recognizing the passion and curiosity they brought to

every meeting."

From luxury labels

to budget brands, the students witnessed the full scope of fashion production, gaining insights into how products move from the designer's sketchpad to the retail floor. Each visit showcased the behind-the-scenes strategy of apparel production, including merchandising, purchasing, factory production, marketing, sales, and public relations.

"We wanted our students to not only see but also experience the entire lifecycle of fashion," said Theisen. "It's one thing to learn from a textbook, but it's another to feel the pulse of the Garment District and to speak with the people making these massive brands tick."

Alongside these day-to-day adventures, the group also made cultural stops at some of the city's most iconic landmarks. Museums such as the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA) and the Metropolitan Museum of Art (The Met), as well

"This trip wasn't just about the business of fashion," added Blalock. "It was about understanding the culture and energy that inspires so much of what happens in this industry." Throughout the trip, the students demonstrated the adaptability and intellectual curiosity that Belhaven University values. Whether asking thoughtful questions during industry leader presentations or embracing the unfamiliar pace of

the right questions, which extended our visits in the best way possible. Every industry leader was impressed by their aptitude and curiosity."







MISSISSIPPI ARTS COMMISSION AWARDS BELHAVEN UNIVERSITY ART PROFESSOR GRANT

The Mississippi Arts Commission (MAC) has awarded Nate Theisen, Co-Chair and Professor of Art and Design Department, an Artist Fellowship grant in the area of visual art.

"I plan to use this grant to enhance the conceptualization, articulation, and reach of my threedimensional work," said Theisen. "This grant will bring an element of freedom to experience the work of other artists directly by traveling to see it and also have the resources to procure quality materials. I also believe this grant will benefit the quality of my students' experience by showcasing to them a broader range of possibilities."

The MAC Artist Fellowship program is funded by MAC and the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), a federal agency, with additional support from the Mississippi State Legislature. Awards were made in 104 Mississippi House of Representatives districts and 60 state Senate districts.

Theisen teaches sculpture, twoand three-dimensional design, and painting. He received his B.F.A. with an emphasis in painting from the University of South Dakota and an M.F.A. in painting with a minor

in sculpture from Wichita State University. He also apprenticed in Germany under sculptor Anatol Herzfeld, a student of Joseph Beuys. Previously, Theisen taught at Butler County Community College in Kansas and Wichita State University.

> "As an educator, I have the privilege of teaching emerging artists to discover their voice, articulate their vision, and think about what success in their field means," observed

Theisen. "In this vein, my work serves as a visual representation of the possibilities of making. It illustrates, hopefully, a way to navigate through the difficult aspects of being an artist such as overcoming fear, iterating concepts, a serious commitment to craftsmanship, and the resolution of a work of art."

BELHAVEN ART PROFESSOR LAUNCHES NEW BOARD GAME: RED TIDES

Jon Micah Tyson, Co-Chair of the Art and Design Department and Assistant Professor of Art and game designer Nick Raynor have teamed up to create *Red Tides: A Tale of* New Caribbea. This collaboration blends Tyson's artistic vision with Raynor's game design expertise to deliver an immersive experience for board game enthusiasts and art lovers alike.

Red Tides is a 1-4 player cooperative dice battler with rich RPG elements. Set in the piratethemed world of New Caribbea, players build and upgrade their ship to challenge Pirate King John Davies. The game combines influences from World of Warcraft, Mega Man, and Sid Meier's Pirates!, with over 100 custom dice and physical ship upgrades. As Professor Tyson says, "It just feels good to roll a ton of dice!"

Tyson has infused the game with personal touches, drawing inspiration

MISSISSIPPI HUMANITIES COUNCIL HONORS BELHAVEN FACULTY WITH 2024 AWARD

Dr. Elissa Sartwell, Chair and Professor of Theatre at Belhaven, has been awarded the prestigious 2024 Mississippi Humanities Council Teacher Award, recognizing her contributions to humanities education in Mississippi. Provost Dr. Audrey Kelleher praised Sartwell's excellence as an educator and her role in highlighting the strength of humanities faculty across the state.

As part of the award, Sartwell delivered a public lecture titled "Toward a Theatre of Connection" on February 26, 2024, at Belhaven's Student Center Theatre.



Sartwell was also recognized at the Mississippi Humanities Council's annual awards banquet in the spring.

Sartwell holds degrees from George Fox University and Louisiana State University and teaches a variety of theatre courses, including acting, directing, script analysis, and dramaturgy. She also directs for the department's theatre season and serves as the Artistic Director for Belhaven Theatre.

As a director, acting coach, and dramaturg, Sartwell focuses on plays that explore themes of forgiveness and reconciliation. She employs Stanislavski's later action-based acting approach, as articulated by Declan Donnellan, emphasizing the integration of body, breath, and voice in performance. Her work has been recognized by the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival for direction, ensemble devising, and dramaturgy.

Sartwell has worked as a production dramaturg at New Stage Theatre for productions such as *Silent Sky*, *The Diary of Anne Frank*, *Sweat*, and *Morningside*. During her graduate studies, she served as a resident dramaturg at Swine Palace.

As a theatre historian, Sartwell's research explores how history

is written and codified through performance, with a specific focus on ethnicity in 19th-century American theatre. She has presented papers at various conferences, including the Association for Theatre in Higher Education and the Mid-American Theatre Conference.

DANCE PROFESSOR NAMED ADJUDICATOR FOR HONG KONG BALLET COMPETITION

Professor of Dance and Director of Ballet Ravenna Wagnon served as an adjudicator for the Hong Kong Ballet Group Stars Award on September 6-11, 2023. This prestigious competition is a major ballet event in Hong Kong, providing an opportunity for local ballet schools to compete. The competitors performed solo and group works in ballet and contemporary styles for both junior and senior age groups.



The Hong Kong Ballet Group, formed in 1964 by local ballet teachers, has dedicated itself to providing an impartial platform for students to perform full-length works and participate in master classes and seminars. This honor holds special significance to Wagnon, who grew up in Hong Kong and was trained in ballet there from the age of seven to sixteen.

Wagnon reflected, "As a young ballet student in Hong Kong during the 1970s, my summer holidays were spent participating with students from other schools, working with guest artists invited by the Hong Kong Ballet Group. I remember those events as impressionable and inspiring."

Her most recent performance with the Hong Kong Ballet Group was in 2004 when she played the role of The Queen Mother in *Swan Lake*.

During the competition, Wagnon reconnected with ballet colleagues and fellow adjudicators Septime Webre, Artistic Director of the Hong Kong Ballet, and Ou Lu, Head of Ballet at the Hong Kong Academy of Performing Arts. She also observed how other countries teach dance. Wagnon added, "I was excited to revisit Hong Kong after 19 years (and 45 years since my study there) to see the emerging generation of dancers and reflect on the progress and development of the art form over the past 45 years."

Wagnon plans to share her experiences with her Belhaven dance students, highlighting examples of how ballet is studied and performed in other countries. She also noted the unique styles that reflect students' cultures and backgrounds.

Prior to Lynchburg, Killelea spent eight seasons as a part of the Covenant College volleyball program as both a player and coach. Killelea served as the assistant coach at Covenant from 2020-22, helping the Scots win the Collegiate Conference of the South and reach an NCAA Regional in 2022.



The final day of the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships marked a historic achievement for Belhaven's Track & Field program. Ashaunti Barnes earned a bronze medal in the Women's 400 Meters with a program-record time of 54.93 seconds, securing the highest-ever finish for the team. Kelsey Singleton

also claimed bronze in the Men's 400 Meters, narrowly missing his record by 0.01 seconds. Neal Terry placed 21st in the Men's Triple Jump, capping off a stellar season. The Blazers made history with a record number of NCAA qualifiers, solidifying their national presence.

BRETT SANCHEZ NAMED DEBASEBALL.COM ALL-AMERICAN

Brett Sanchez was named to the D3baseball.com All-America Second Team, following his selection to the All-Region VI First Team. This marks his third All-America recognition, having previously earned Second Team honors in 2022 and First Team in 2023. He was also named National Pitcher of the Year in 2023.

Sanchez, a Slidell, Louisiana native, entered the season as a Preseason All-American and delivered an impressive 2024 campaign, going 7-2 with a 2.52 ERA, 93 strikeouts, and five complete games. He holds multiple career records at Belhaven, including pitching wins (33) and strikeouts (408).

In addition to his national accolades, Sanchez was named Pitcher of the Year in the Collegiate Conference of the South and an All-CCS First Team selection. He was a finalist for the Boo Ferriss Trophy, awarded to Mississippi's top collegiate player.

This year's class is comprised of two former student-athletes and one former coach representing three of Belhaven's 17 intercollegiate athletics programs. The honorees were inducted into the Belhaven Athletics Hall of Fame on Saturday, September 28th, as part of this year's Homecoming festivities.



DOMINIQUE CORONA, SOFTBALL

Dominique Corona was a standout performer for the Belhaven Softball program from 2013-15, helping to establish the Blazers as one of the premier programs in the NAIA. Corona's career was highlighted by a stellar 2014 season in which she was named the Southern States Athletic Conference (SSAC) Player of the Year and an NAIA First Team All-American. She was twice named an SSAC First Team All-Conference player and named to the SSAC Gold Glove team while also earning a pair of NFCA All-East Region First Team nods. Corona ranks inside the Top 10 in career Batting Average, Doubles, Walks, and On-Base Percentage while also leading the Blazers to three straight NAIA Tournament appearances during her career.



RICKY OWENS, BASEBALL

Ricky Owens was a star player for the Belhaven Baseball program from 2003-07 where he helped lead the Blazers to some of the program's most successful seasons. Owens was a four-time GCAC All-Conference player while playing a pivotal role in the Blazers winning the GCAC Championship in 2004, 2006 and 2007. Owens and the Blazers also earned a spot in three NAIA National Tournaments during those conference championship years. Owens still ranks as the Blazers' all-time career leader in hits, doubles, RBI, and at-bats while also ranking 2nd all-time in home runs.



TOM KELSEY, MEN'S BASKETBALL

A legendary coach in the world of collegiate basketball and one of the most impactful leaders of the Belhaven Men's Basketball program, Tom Kelsey was the Head Coach of the Blazers from 2005-12. Kelsey led the Blazers to a pair of NAIA National Tournament Appearances in 2010 and 2012. During his tenure, Kelsey amassed the 2nd most wins in program history with 121, trailing only Hall of Famer Charles Rugg. Kelsey also holds the program's highest career win percentage among coaches with over 100 games coached at .548. In the 2009-10 season, Kelsey led the Blazers to the most wins in a single campaign in program history, 24, and was named the GCAC Coach of the Year.

A LIFELONG COMMITMENT TO HEALING: DR. MAXIE GORDON'S JOURNEY FROM BELHAVEN TO MEDICAL LEADERSHIP

Dr. Maxie Gordon's journey to becoming a nationally-recognized medical leader reflects his perseverance, faith, and dedication to service.

His time at Belhaven University,
beginning in 1979, was marked by
leadership on and off the soccer
field. Whether serving as a resident
assistant, in student government, or as
president of both the Belhaven Science
Organization and Students for Cultural Awareness,

Organization and Students for Cultural Awareness, Gordon's commitment to service was clear. His time at Belhaven also shaped his Christian faith, drawing inspiration from Matthew 25:34-40.

After earning a degree in biology in 1983, Gordon continued his studies at Jackson State University and was inducted into the Beta Beta Beta Biological Honor Society. He also served his community through political consulting, hospital management, and as an election commissioner for Jackson, Mississippi.

Gordon's medical career took shape at Meharry Medical College, where he graduated with honors in 1995. He completed a combined residency in internal medicine and psychiatry at the Brody School of Medicine in North Carolina, where he served as chief resident for both programs and founded the medical/psychiatry unit. His work in rural North Carolina and northeast Mississippi as a medical director focused on improving care in underserved areas and addressing health disparities.



"I grew up in the city of Jackson and in a community that was under privileged; therefore, many people did not have access to healthcare. I saw people use lots of home remedies in order to take care of themselves. When I went to medical school, I decided to invest in an education that would help me fill in the gaps I saw. The reasons had to do with my Christian experience at Belhaven and that led me to having a heart for the needs of less fortunate people. One of the main

points of our clinic is that we don't restrict access. We try and help people regardless of their financial means; therefore, we donate a lot of work. There are some who believe that healthcare is a right. In fact, a civil right. I believe that has been my mission from the start," said Gordon.

Today, Gordon serves as medical director of Gordon Medical Arts Clinic in Clinton, Mississippi, and as a faculty member at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine. His contributions to medical education have earned him multiple awards, including "Best On-Call Attending" and "Teacher of the Year." He remains active in professional and community organizations, including the Mississippi Psychiatric Association and 100 Black Men of America, Jackson chapter, where he received the President's Award for outstanding service.

Gordon's story is a remarkable example of a life dedicated to service, reflecting his impact in medicine, education, and his community. His journey demonstrates the lasting influence Belhaven alumni can have on the world.







Dr. Westley Floyd Busbee passed away peacefully at age 84 on July 20, 2024, in Alpharetta, Georgia, surrounded by his family.
